## Brief History of Stadium

The Ernest F. Ladd Memorial Stadium, one of Mobile's major civic assets, will be one year old officially on October 1, the date last year when the facility was formally dedicated and presented to the people of Mobile.

Financed as a non-profit undertaking by the Merchants National Bank, bank directors, officers and closely affiliated business interests, and the late Mr. Ladd's immediate family, the stadium originally cost about \$825,000, but recent improvements and additions have brought the total expenditure to approximately \$850,000. Purchase of the 43-acre site and grading, draining and paving of streets in the area—all provided by the City of Mobile —

brought the total cost of the facility to well over \$1,000,000. Grading and drainage was begun in May of 1946, and foundation work was started in July of 1947. A steel shortage, however, delayed start of steel erection until February of 1948.

The stadium was constructed as a non-profit undertaking for the enjoyment and education of the people of Mobile. The stadium's affairs are governed by a self-perpetuating Board of Trustees, and net income from its operation may be used only for extension or improvement of its facilities and for investment in public parks and playgrounds in the County of Mobile.

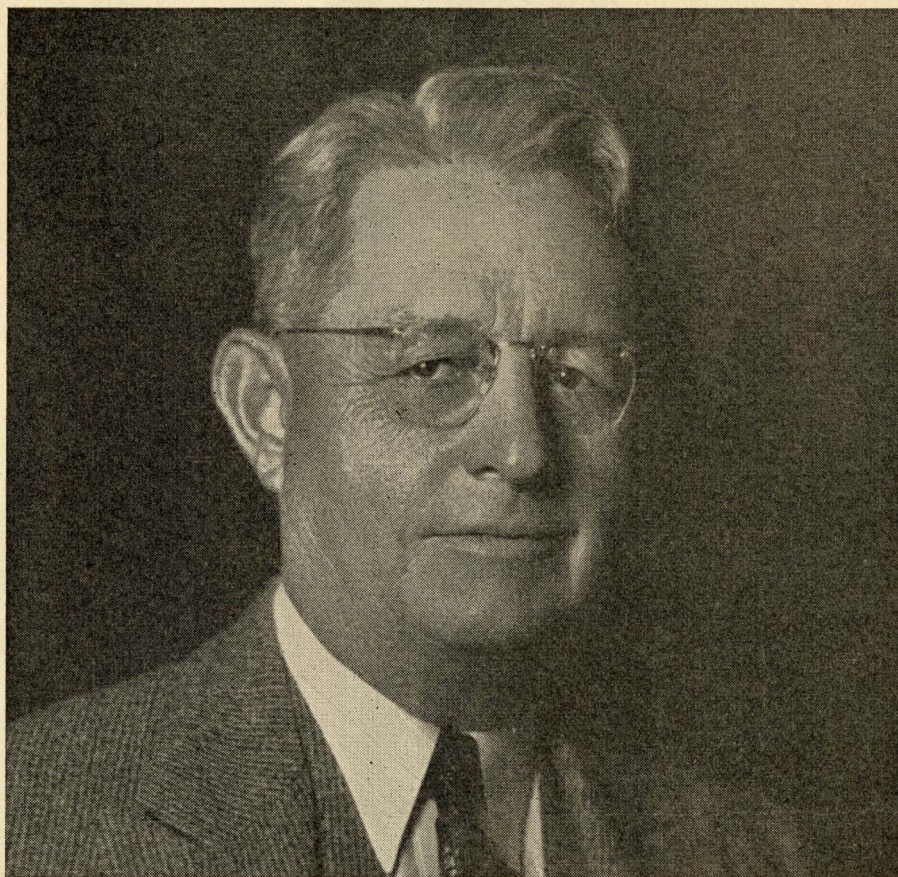

# Ernest Fleetwood Ladd

1876 - 1941



Ernest F. Ladd Memorial Stadium, which now is being used for its second football season, was built to commemorate the lifetime of distinguished civic service of Ernest Fleetwood Ladd, president of the Merchants National Bank of this city for more than 25 years.

Mr. Ladd, who died August 3, 1941, was a native Mobilian, one of the South's most able business men and an active sports enthusiast. During his school days here he was an outstanding athlete and in later life was greatly interested in hunting, fishing and golf. His favorite spectator sports were football and baseball.

Often mentioned as "one of the five great men of his generation in Mobile," Mr. Ladd has justifiably received much of the credit for

Mobile's ascendancy, during the past 25 years, as one of the major industrial ports in the nation.

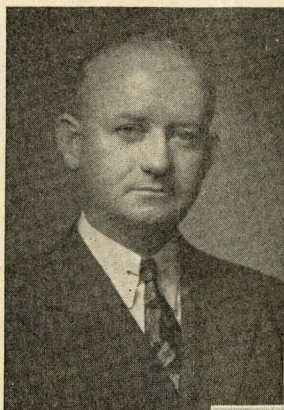
Besides being the dominant influence in building the Merchants National Bank to the important position it occupies in the community, Mr. Ladd also served as a director of several large business enterprises in various parts of the South, and the effect of his influence and leadership was both broad and constructive.

In the words of the Stadium Board, the stadium which bears his name is "a fitting memorial indeed . . . to his keen interest in athletic activities and a belief in them as a beneficial influence in the life of a community."

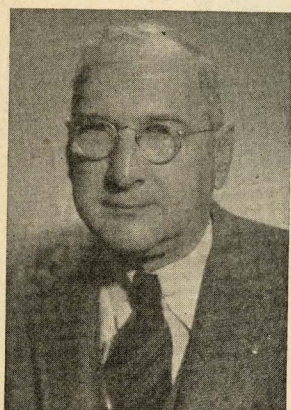
