#### RENEWED FEUD

The Auburn Tigers and the Tulane Green Wave meet today in a Southeastern Conference football battle which, if it follows its predecessors, will produce more than its quota of hard play and scoring thrills.

Today's engagement marks the 28th meeting of Auburn and Tulane gridiron representatives in a series which had its inception back in 1902.

Since that time, the Green Wave has managed to maintain a slim margin in the victory column. At this point, Tulane has run up 11 conquests to 10 for the Auburnites while an unusual large number, six, have been fought to a deadlock. And four of these games were scoreless which will serve as an indication of the spirited play the two teams save for this traditional battle.

Auburn, coached by Carl Voyles, this season again has one of the top offensive performers on the football scene. He is Sophomore Travis Tidwell, who last season led the nation in combined rushing and passing gains, which is no small feat. Tidwell, however, will not appear in the starting lineup for the Tigers nor will he play most of the game.

Hurt last spring playing baseball for the Tigers, Tidwell's ankle has never quite healed. So his play will be in particularly opportune spots for the Auburn cause and, of necessity, will be brief since he still wears braces. Despite this handicap, it has been the passing of Tidwell which has netted the Auburn eleven the success it has already met in reaching paydirt. It was thus when the Plainsmen defeated Florida and when they scored the first touchdown of the season against the potent Georgia Tech team.

Offensively Tulane came into its own in the third period of last week's battle with Ole Miss. The Green Wave's spread formations, accurate passing and its deceptive reverses netted a pair of quick touchdowns against the favored Rebels. The Wavemen will attempt to capitalize on these same assets when they meet the Tigers today.

Jim Keeton and Bennie Ellender will be plotting the thrusts toward the Auburn goal line while Don Fortier, Johnny Campora, Eddie Price and Ray Prats will attempt to execute the maneuvers designed to pay off in touchdowns.
