Dear Mother

I now take the pleasure of writing you a few lines to let you know that I am well & I hope these few lines will find you the ~~the~~ same I have not heard a word from you since the 12 of Jan I have wrote as much as 4 to you since I received one from you & I thought that I would write to day as a steamer was going Sunday to the North I received one from Uncle Dav^d it was dated the 28 of Jan & he wrote that the folks were all well then. & I wrote to him the same day that I received his letter & I was very glad to hear from

the folks to the North
I want you to write & let
me know if you have received
any money. I wrote to Uncle
& told him that if you wanted
any money for him to let you
have it. we shall be paid of
again next month & then
I will send some more home to
Uncle so it will not make
much difference with him I guess
I wrote a letter to Deerfield last
week I had not heard a word
from them & so I thought that
I would write a few lines to
them about the war
I wrote to Uncle for him to
send me some postage stamps
& I want you to tell him
about it so if he does not
receive my letter that he will
know if I have got out of
money & most out of stamps

but one thing I have on my
side that is my credit is
good & so I do not worry
if I am out of money
the report is to day that
we are going home the first
of June & I guess it is so for
the manager said so & he would
not have said so if it had not
been so & if it is not so
we are on the last half if it
is not out until the 6 of
July if the last half goes
away as fast as the first
half it will not be but
a little while at the longest
& week out here does not seem
as 2 days in N^o H I can
hardly keep the days of
the weeks they slip away
so fast. I like bettr & bettr
every day that I stay I
do not know but what I

shall inlist for 3 years
they want 50 men out
of this Regt to go into
the caverly & this I can
hav A horse to ride
but I do not think that
I shall go as A Privet if
I go I shal have som ofic
I will now close so good by
from your son out in the
sunny south D P Mason

I should have room to
write to you all but my
