Camp Parapet  
Carrollton. La.

Dear Mother I now take up  
the pleasure of answering your  
letter that I received yesterday  
I was very glad to hear that  
you were all well. I am well  
but I have got a soar on my  
thumb but it is getting better  
now & I hope it will get well  
soon. you wrote that you have  
heard from that money that  
I sent to Mr Hoyt you wrote  
that he had let it out but  
Uncle David said that he had  
seen him & he gave him \$30.00  
to told him that I sent it  
to him. I wrote to you  
before that I thought that we  
should be paid again that  
week but we have not been  
paid yet & I do not know  
when we shall be paid

you wrote that you had  
to work very hard I do not  
want you to work so hard  
you know what I hav told  
you I told you why I went  
to the war was so I could get  
all the money I could so you  
could have A home I not hav  
to work so hard. I hav got  
money enough so you ~~want~~  
need not kill your self with  
work if it so hapnes that  
I never get back to N<sup>o</sup> H I  
told Uncle what to do with  
my money I told him to  
see that you had A home &  
he said that he would. I  
trust he will. I do not think  
that I shall be contented when  
I get back to N<sup>o</sup> H if I do  
you know that I do not hav  
eny one to lok out for only  
you & my self & I calculate

to look out for you as long  
as I live & you live for I think  
that it belongs to mee  
it is very helthy out hear now  
this has not but one die for 2  
weeks & you know that this would  
as much as that die out of  
1000 men if we was in N.Y.C  
you wrote that it was all news  
to you about the washing machine  
I calculated for it to be I want  
him to get it present it to  
you for a surprise presant but  
I see he did not do it I do not  
think much of him eny way  
& I will tell him so if I get  
back to N.Y.C again

I wrote to you befor I told  
you that I had seen Elder  
D.P. Ciley & he was very glad  
to see mee he did think that  
you had A son so large he  
wanted me to be sure ~~for~~

I write I tell you that  
he likes first rate & wanted  
to tell you that he sent his  
best respects to you all  
giv my love to all you  
see that I know I tell them  
that I am well I like first  
rate. from your Son D.P.M.
