Juan Lana with the others who are named below, paid ten pesos as that (instalment) corresponding to the three months of July, August, and September, of said year at the rate of forty pesos annually that they must pay for the permit that they enjoy for Inns and Public Establishments.

Ignacio Barsau, in place of Santiago Eliot, with only one "Villar" table.	10.

Claudio Chavo, five pesos for only an Inn at the rate of twenty pesos annually.	5.

Juan Utran, with the others that are named, fifteen pesos for the Inn and two "Villares" at the rate of sixty pesos per year.	15.

Joseph Rouby obtained a license the tenth of the current month of September for one table of a game called "El Chino" (The Chinaman), after the fashion of a "Villar", paying annually the same tax of forty pesos, and he paid two pesos one real for the twenty days.	2.	1.
