Francisco Pascalis de la Barre. To wit:

Item. Two hundred twenty-two pesos by the tax on four hundred forty-four barrels of flour at the rate of four reales a barrel, which the following bakers have used in this month. Santiago Mouton, 87; Juan Jourdan, 90; Felipe Landau, 55; Joseph Druet, 40; Dalmasio Sala, 50; Pedro Quieno, 30; and Francisco Landreaux, 12; which items total said amount.	222.
