By the Commissioners appointed for the purpose of ascertaining the rights of persons to Lands, within the District and Territory aforesaid; It is hereby certified, That

The Legal Representatives of Edward Murphy dec'd of the County of Natchitoches are confirmed in their claim to a tract of Land containing one hundred and fourteen and $\frac{2}{100}$ American acres founded on an order of Survey in favour of Etienne Unger for three arpens and one quarter front by the depth of forty signed by His then Governor of the Province of Louisiana without date the petition is dated the 19th of June 1782 with proof of settlement on and about eleven years previous to the 1st of October 1800 situated in the county of Natchitoches on the left Bank of Red River about five quarters of a league from the Post bounded above by Ramsay Poissot Survey staled in the order of survey to be laid out as conformable as can be with a plat of Survey filed in the claims dated the 24th of February 1806 and signed by Saml. Cook an authorized surveyor to embrace the above expressed quantity of land To have

Such form and marks, natural and artificial, as shall be represented in a Plan thereof, to be returned by the Principal Deputy Survey of the said District; **Wherefore**, agreeably to the provisions of an Act of Congress, passed the third day of March, 1807, entitled "An Act respecting the claims to land in the Territories of Orleans and Louisiana," the Claimant is entitled to a patent from the United States, for the above described tract of land or so much thereof as is not rightfully claimed by any other person unless the same shall be found to include either a Lead Mine or Salt Spring. This certificate being filed with the Register of the Land Office for the said District, within twelve months from the date hereof, shall entitle the claimant to the Certificate of the said Register, on which a Patent shall issue.

Given under our hands at Opelousas Church, this 15th day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and twelve and in the thirty sixth year of the Independence of the United States
