1<sup>o</sup> William negro man aged 48 years - 2<sup>o</sup> His wife Sally, a mulatto woman aged 38 years - and her six children - 3<sup>o</sup> Elina mulatto girl aged 15 years - 4<sup>o</sup> Ernest mulatto boy aged eleven years, 5<sup>o</sup> Guillaume a griffe aged 9 years - 6<sup>o</sup> William aged 5 years - 7<sup>o</sup> Julienne mulatto girl aged 3 years - and 8<sup>o</sup> Octave a child aged 8 months - 9<sup>o</sup> Nicholas a mulatto man aged 50 years - and his wife 10<sup>o</sup> Polly aged 38 years - George negro man aged 28 years - 12<sup>o</sup> Alfred mulatto man aged 28 years - 13<sup>o</sup> Alexander negro man aged twenty seven years - 14<sup>o</sup> Edmond mulatto boy aged 18 years 15<sup>o</sup> Minerva, mulatto woman aged 20 years, and her two children 16<sup>o</sup> Rosalie aged 3 years - and 17<sup>o</sup> Lomer aged nine months.

And I do further Certify that at the time of the passing of said act of Sale, there existed on the plantation therein mentioned and described, and of which one undivided third part was sold to said Adolphe Dupuy, by said Aubry Dupuy, no mortgage, except those in favor of the Citizens Bank of Louisiana, to wit: 1<sup>o</sup> One as security for two hundred and twenty five Shares of Stock in said Bank, amounting to the sum of twenty two thousand five hundred Dollars, by act before Charles Boudousquie Esq<sup>r</sup> Notary Public in New Orleans passed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1841. and recorded the 22<sup>nd</sup> March 1841. - And 2<sup>o</sup> One as security for fifty Shares of Stock in the said Citizens Bank of Louisiana, amounting to the
