& Yacinthe Reynault, of the one part.

And Miss Mary Brown native of Dublin in
Ireland, daughter of Clement Brown Esq. and of
Catharine O'Connell of the other part.

The aforesaid saint Julien de Toumillon and
widow P. Livingston Jones, by the advice & consent
of their relations and friends undersigned, have
mutually agreed & consented to be united in
marriage, and to solemnize the same in the
face of our holy mother, church, when either
may be thereto requested by the other, under the
conditions & stipulations following, to wit:

Art. first.

The future spouses shall be one, and in community
with respect to all estate, possessions, or rights
moveable & immovable, to begin from the day
of the celebration of said nuptials, conformably
to the laws & customs of this state in that behalf.

Art. 2. All & every the debts & obligations, contracted by

either of the future spouses before the celebration of the said nuptials, shall be paid or fulfilled by the party having so contracted, without prejudice to the other or to the community.

Art. 3. The estate, possessions & rights of the said widow consist in a plantation known by the name of widow Wittz and also twenty six negro slaves.

Art. 4. The estate of the said intended husband, amount to the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, consisting in moveables, merchandise, credits & immovables.

Art. 5. In case of the dissolution of said marriage by the death of the future husband, without issue living of the said marriage, the said future husband in order to give the strongest proof of the friendship he bears to his said future spouse and to her children, does by these presents make her full and entire gift to his said intended spouse without condition or reserve, as well of the acquets to the future community, as of all his estate of what nature soever, and thus everything herein contained and all and singular the articles of this contract have been fully agreed and consented to by the said parties, promising to observe the same with fidelity, and renouncing everything which may be opposed thereto, or which

might controvert the same.

Done and payed in the Parish of East Caton
Range on the plantation of the said P. Livingston
Jones widow the twenty third day of the month
of September in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & thirteen and the thirty eighth
year of the Independence of the united States of
America in presence of the relations & friends
of the parties who have subscribed their names
