"I know all men by these premises that I  
Wm. Deacon have this 23<sup>d</sup> day of Nov 1816, bargained  
and sold unto Edward Duffel, to have and  
to hold unto him and his heirs forever a  
certain negro boy named Frank, aged about  
twenty five years about five feet six inches  
black; for and in consideration of the sum  
of Eight hundred dollars the receipt of which  
I hereby acknowledge (Signed) Wm. Deacon.  
Witness present (Signed) C. L. Anderson = Henry Casey.

Recorded the twelfth day of February Eighteen  
hundred & thirty at the Parish of Iberville  
State of Louisiana (Signed) Edward Duffel, Parish Judge

"Received of Edward Duffel five hundred  
dollars for a negro man named Billy, a slave  
for life. I do warrant him against all claims  
rehearsal. Done Orangeville June 18<sup>th</sup> 1822 (Signed)

I hereby certify that an act of Sale  
passed before Guibourg Ridgely Stanger on  
the 13 January 1829, from ~~Wm C Duffel~~  
Major Andrew Price of Nashville Tennessee  
to Edward Duffel, of a Slave named Aime  
aged about 22 years for three hundred & twenty  
five dollars Cash, was duly recorded in Book  
No 8 p. 318 of Notarial Acts in my office - on the  
12 February Eighteen hundred & thirty  
also that a sale from Wm C Duffel to  
Edward Duffel, passed before John A Duncan  
the 2 February 1829, of a Mulatto woman aged  
twenty nine named Malonia & her child  
Stephen two years old, for four hundred &  
fifty dollars paid in two notes —  
was recorded on same day in same Register  
page 319 - Witness my hand & Seal of office  
Paris le 14 Janvier 1834

Know all men by these presents that I  
John Latour of the City of Baltimore, for  
and in consideration of the sum of Six  
hundred dollars, current money of Baltimore  
to me in hand paid by Edward Duffield  
of New Orleans, the receipt whereof I do  
hereby acknowledge and myself of these  
writings, satisfied, have bargained  
sold & delivered, and by these presents do  
bargain sell and deliver unto the said  
Edward Duffield his Executor Administrator  
& assigns a certain negro boy named Nathaniel  
aged about eighteen years a slave for life -  
We have and to hold the said negro boy  
Nathaniel, unto the said Edward Duffield  
his Executor Administrator and Assigns  
to the only proper use and behoof of the said  
Edward Duffield, his Executor Administrator  
and Assigns forever. And the said John  
Latour for himself his Executor Administra-  
-tory the said bargained boy Nathaniel  
unto the said Duffield, his Executor Ad-  
-ministrator & Assigns against all persons  
shall & with former warrant and default  
by these presents. In witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal the  
twenty sixth day of October in the year  
one thousand eight hundred and Sixteen  
(Signed) J Latour (Seal) Signed sealed and  
delivered in the presence of (Signed) J Pournairat.  
Recorded the twelfth day of February Eighteen  
hundred & thirty at the parish of the eastern  
State of Louisiana (Signed) Edward Duffield, Parish Judge
