

Jackson April 13. 1840

Dear Sir

after leaving Natchez I went to my plantation in Yazoo City and have just reached home and am in receipt of yours of the 8th inst advising me that suit will be instituted on the 15th inst. by the College against me this I sincerely hope will not be done as I am and will exert myself to meet the views of the College. Our Board meets to day and will be in session a few days when he assured I will come down and attend to the matter & will go to Wilkinson & do Mr. Cahoy. I will render doubly secure the College of required funds making such payment as is required. You can save no time by presenting the matter before it comes down. I hope you will postpone the matter apart from the moral obligation I am compelled to comply with the requests of the College having sold the land or no matter as far as to me
