I the undersigned Recorder and ex-officio Conservator of Mortgages, in and for the Parish of Terrebonne, and State of Louisiana duly commissioned and sworn, do hereby certify from the Records in my Office, that against the hereinafter described property, standing ~~in~~ name of Mrs Mathilde Toups, Widow of Henry Claiborne Thibodaux, in her own name and as Tutrix of her minor children, viz:

First. The undivided two thirds of a sugar plantation called "Sainte Brigitte," situated in the Parish of Terrebonne, in this State, on both sides of Bayou Terrebonne, at about five miles from the town of Thibodaux, containing more or less eighteen hundred and five arpents in superficial extent, said plantation being composed of three tracts of land having a front of about thirteen arpents on the West side of said Bayou, by a depth of about eighty arpents, and a front of about twenty three arpents on the East side of said Bayou, by a depth of about thirty arpents, said plantation being bounded above, on the right bank of said Bayou, by lands of H. M. Thibodaux, and on the left bank above by lands of B. P. Thibodaux, and below on both banks of said Bayou by lands of L. Barras and in the rear on Bayou Blue, above by lands of Mrs C. Tanner & Col Key, and below by lands of said L. Barras, together with the Sugar house, engine, dwelling

house, negro cabins, mules and horses, farming utensils, tools & and every thing attached to said plantation without any exception.

Second. And the undivided two thirds of two tracts of land adjoining said plantation in the rear on the East bank of said Bayou Terrebonne, on the Grand Coteau, having about two hundred and forty arpents superficial extent, the whole agreeably to a plan.

There exists the following Mortgage and none others.

First. A Judicial Mortgage in favor of Jules Levois, and against Mrs Mathilde Toups in her own name and as Natural Tutrix of the minors, Amelie, Emile, Brigitte, Batey, Mathilde & Claiborne Thibodaux issue of her marriage with Henry Claiborne Thibodaux deceased for the sum of Seven hundred and nine $\frac{1}{2}$ 100 dollars, with interest thereon, at the rate of five per cent per annum from the 28th day of January 1854, until paid, five dollars costs of protest and the costs of Suit of Jules Levois vs. C. D. Burquiere No. 1229, and the costs of these proceedings.

Second. A Judicial Mortgage in favor of Jules Levois, and against Mrs Mathilde Toups Widow of Henry C. Thibodaux, tutrix of her minor children Amelie, Emile, Brigitte, Batey, Mathilde and Claiborne Thibodaux, and Administratrix as such of Succession of H. C. Thibodaux, in her said capacity, for the sum of Seven hundred and Nine $\frac{1}{2}$ 100 dollars, with

interests at the rate of five per cent per annum interest from the 28th of January 1854, and the costs in the case No 1299 of the Decret of this Court & the costs of this case, and five dollars costs of protest, and the Costs of Suit.

Third. A conventional Mortgage in favor of Michel Aimé, and against Henry Claiborne Thibodaux for the sum of thirty five thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars, now reduced of the sum of Eleven thousand dollars, by the cancelling of the note for that amount, to secure the payment of eight promissory notes, payable at the Citizens Bank of Louisiana, as follows to wit. the first for the sum of Sixteen thousand five hundred dollars in four years after date, the second for the sum of Eleven thousand dollars, also in four years after date, the third for the sum of Sixteen hundred and fifty dollars, and the fourth for the sum of Eleven hundred dollars, both in one year after date, the fifth for the sum of Sixteen hundred and fifty dollars and the sixth for the sum of Eleven hundred dollars both in two years after date, and the seventh for the sum of Sixteen hundred & fifty dollars, and the eighth for the sum of Eleven hundred dollars, both in three years after date, all bearing eight per cent per annum interest after maturity till paid.

Miss. Bellocq, Noblem & co., and against Mrs Mathilde
Toups Widow H. C. Thibodaux, in her own name, and in
behalf as in her quality of Natural Tutrix of her minor
children, Amelie, Emilie, Brigitte, Batez, Mathilde,
and Claiborne Thibodaux. issue of her marriage with her
said late husband. for the sum of Thirty six thousand
three hundred and sixteen $2\frac{1}{100}$ dollars, for the reim-
bursement of which she has furnished and subscribed
in her own name and as Tutrix of her minor children,
Seven drafts drawn to the order of, and endorsed by
herself, dated October 21st 1858. and drawn on the
above named firm, the first for the sum of four thousand
four hundred & sixteen $2\frac{1}{100}$ dollars, payable on the
first day of January 1859. the second for the sum of
thirteen hundred and twenty dollars payable March
2nd 1859, the third for eight hundred and eighty dollars
payable March 2nd 1859, the fourth for the sum of
eight hundred and eighty dollars payable March 2nd
1860, the fifth for the sum of thirteen hundred and
twenty dollars payable March 2nd 1860, the sixth
for the sum of sixteen thousand five hundred dollars
payable 2nd March 1861, and the seventh for the sum
of eleven thousand dollars payable March 2nd 1861,
with interest from maturity till paid, at the rate of eight
per cent per annum.

in the Main ^{body of} Plantation, and on the undivided two

East, containing five hundred and ninety nine $7\frac{1}{100}$ acres.

Another tract of land being Lot no. one, of Section
No. 57, and Lot No one, of Section No. 56. in township
13 West of the Mississippi river, of Range Sixteen East,
containing two hundred and eighty-seven acres.

Another tract of land known as the Valery Barras
tract, containing about two hundred and five $50\frac{1}{100}$
acres.

hundred dollars payable January 20th 1862, One note
for two thousand five hundred dollars payable December
10th 1861. One note for two thousand five hundred
