

Tricou House

The Tricou House was built in 1832 as a home and office for the famous New Orleans doctor, Joseph A. Tricou. Dr. Tricou became a local hero when, after treating a wounded duelist, he refused to testify under oath as to the nature of his patient's wounds. The Tricous lived at 711 Bourbon St. until 1874 when the house was sold shortly after the accidental death of Penelope Tricou, the doctor's grand niece who fell down the steps from the third floor. It is said her ghost still haunts this stairway and second floor.

The house is of both historic and architectural importance, receiving a purple (the highest) rating by the U.C.C. and is listed in the U.S. Congressional Archives.
