The Tulane-South Carolina game on October 29 has been designated as "Homecoming Day" for the Green grads.

Dr. Edmond Faust, President of the Tulane Alumni Association, is now busily engaged with his committeemen in preparing for the occasion.

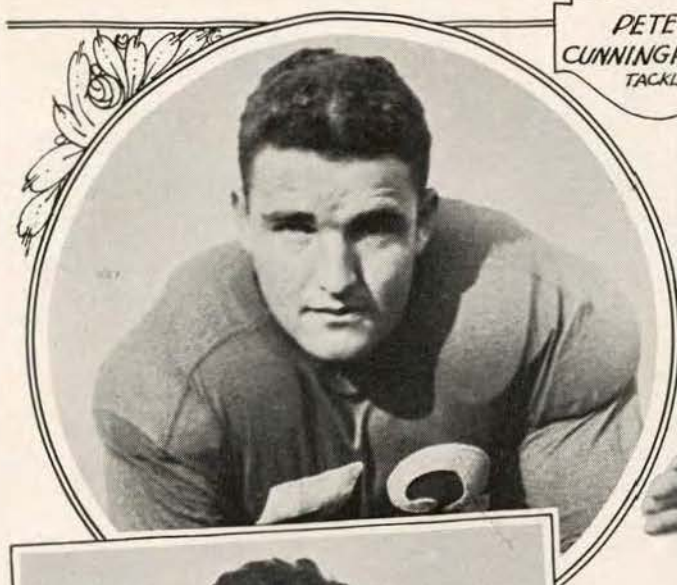

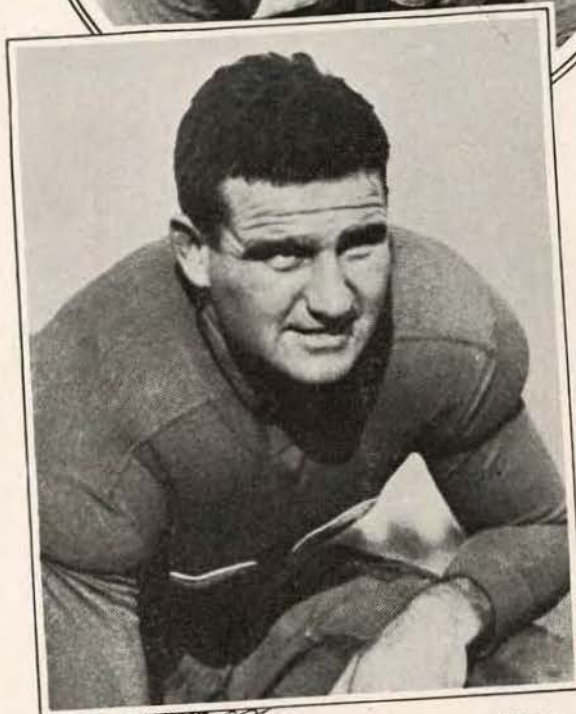

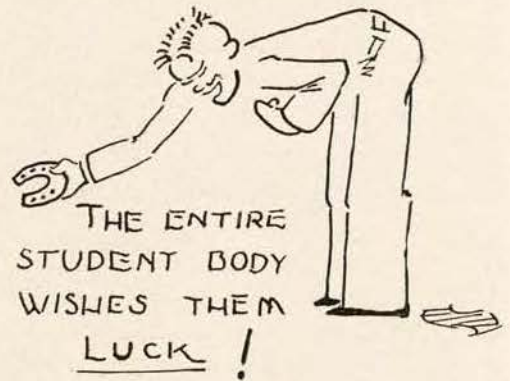
