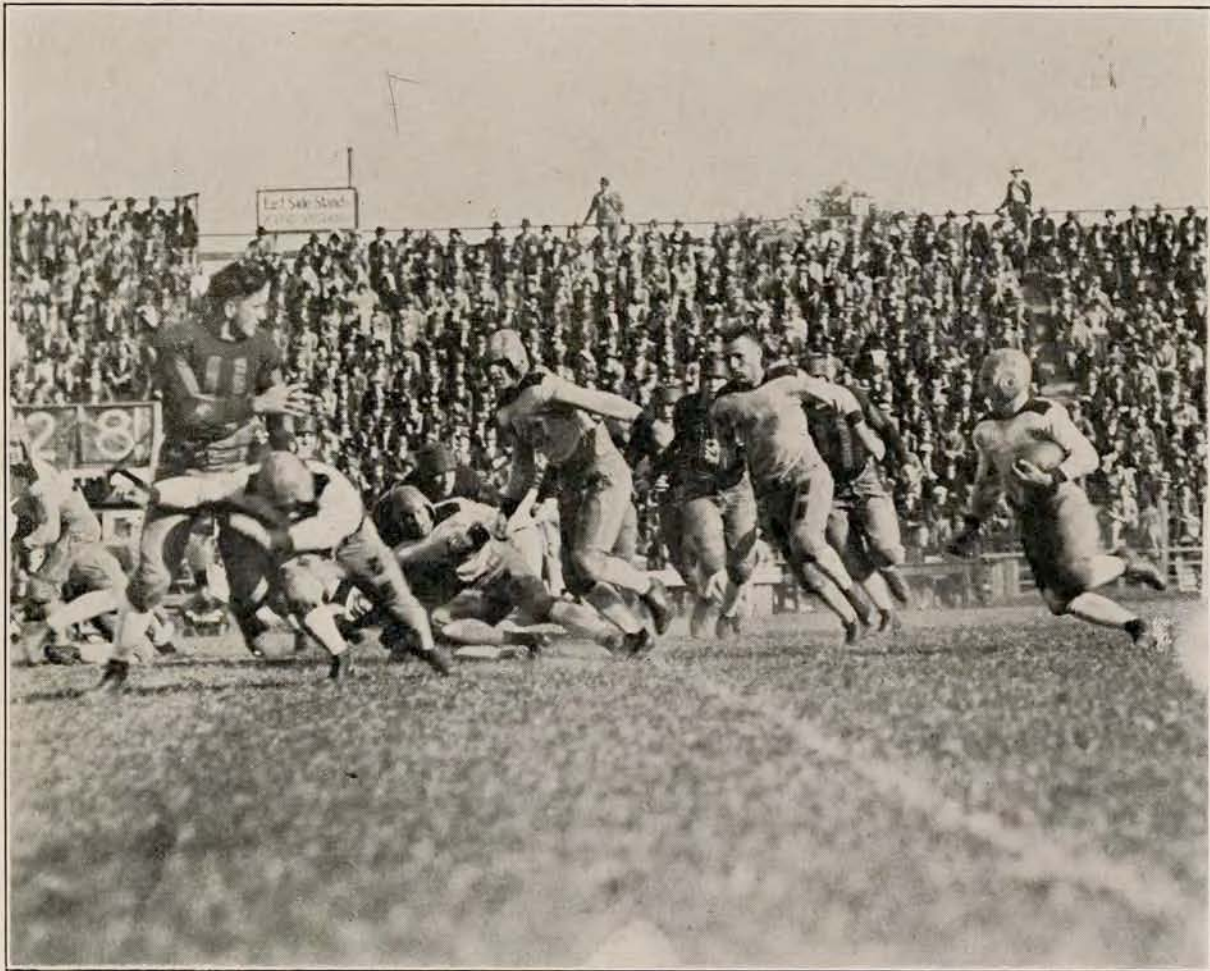

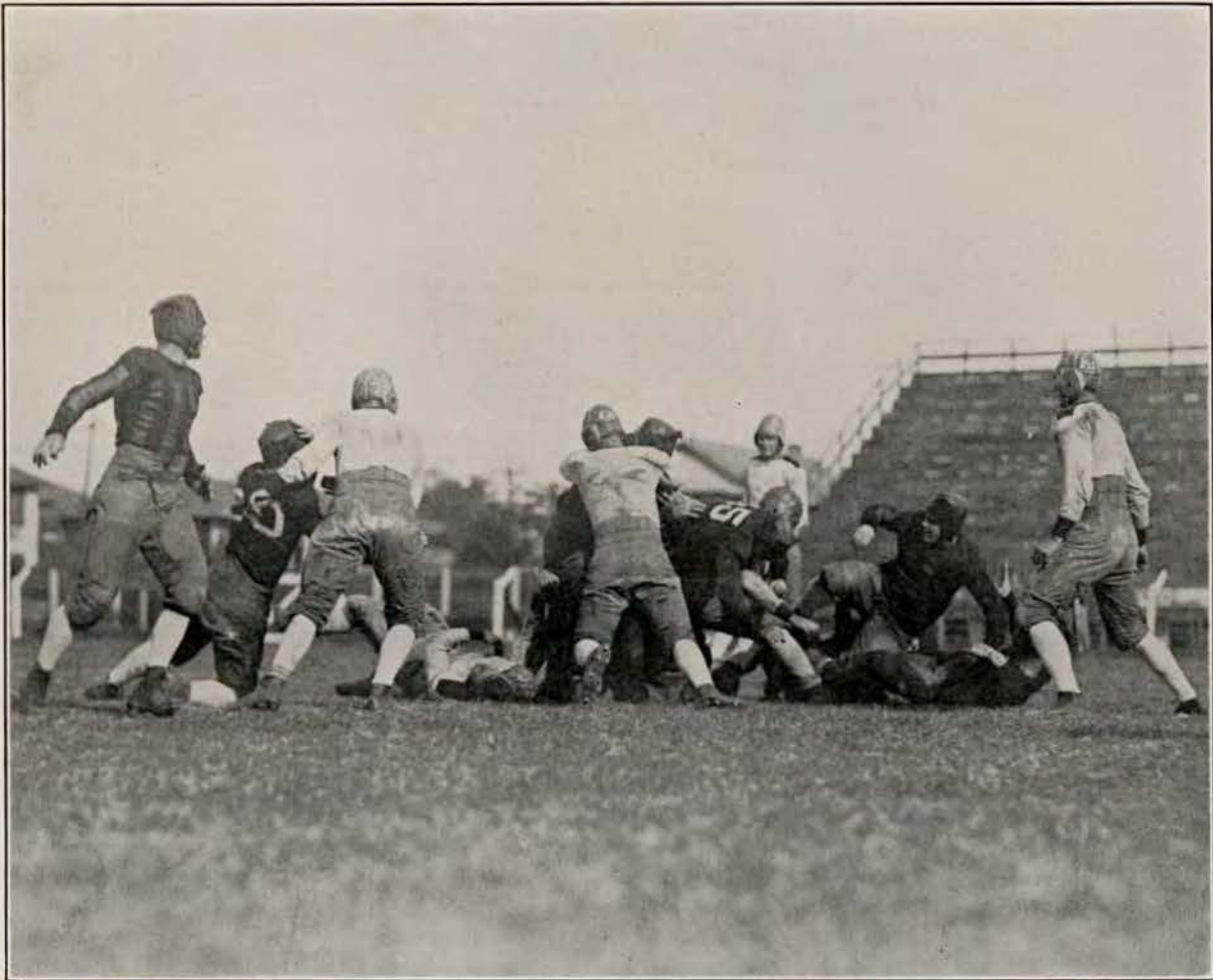

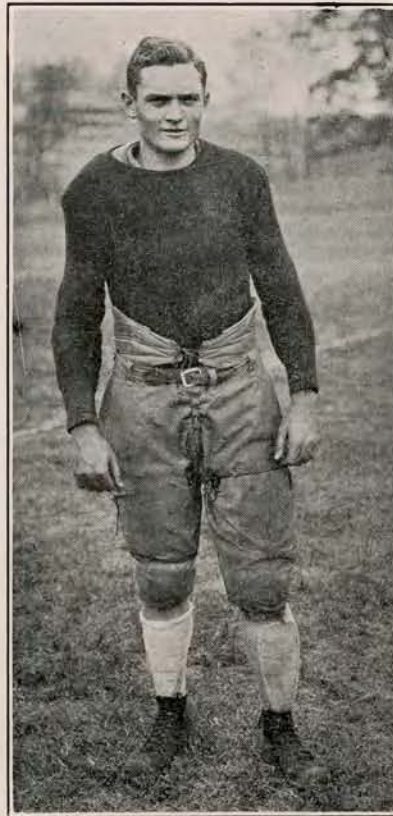

“Remember The Alamo!”

Two evenly weighted, evenly matched and splendidly coached elevens—each trained in the same school of football—a heated rivalry and a revenge angle between two teams that are fighting to stay in the Dixie title race—two great coaches, each idolized by his team and both idolized by Tulane, these are the elements that will make the gridiron fur fly fast when Bernie Bierman, former Minnesota star and associate coach at Tulane last year sends his Mississippi Aggies against the Tulane Greenies of his former team-mate, Clark Shaughnessy, in Tulane stadium today.

Revenge will be much sweeter than the poets ever guessed it could be, for the Green Wave when it dashes with all its fury against the Starkville eleven to blot out from the minds of all that heart-rend-

ing 14-6, overturning of the dope which last year side-tracked the Championship hopes of Shaughnessy and his Greenies.

It all happened in a jiffy last year. A brilliant victory over Vanderbilt, a light work-out with Springhill and then the little harder work-out with the Aggies for the Auburn game a week later. But the Aggies refused to be worked on and, disregarding the dope as our Louisiana State rivals have done on several occasions, the Aggies proceeded to “quarterback sneak” its way to a 14-6 victory

Meeks, Patty, Stephens and Clark form as shifty a set of backfield can expect to face in the South. Patty, an men as the Greenies excellent punter who was kept out of the Tulane game last fall by injuries, will face the Greenies for the first time and his kicking will be a great improvement over the last year booter for the Aggies. the Greenie combination of Lautenschlaeger, Flournoy, Morgan and Lamprecht.

In the line, Bierman has a set of husky forwards who will average 174 pounds against 175 for Tulane.

Corley, giant 198-pound tackle is the biggest man in the Aggie line-up as compared with Blackledge, 200-pound Greenie “big boy.”

Bernie Bierman's eleven will have a neat assortment of tricks if dope runs true to form. Scouts of the Aggies' two games brought back information into the Tulane camp that the Aggies were playing “under wraps” apparently using just enough fancy tactics to win and content in keeping their light under a bushel until the Tulane game.

If his bag of tricks fails to deliver any touchdowns however, Bernie has an ace in the hole in Captain Stone, crack end, who can kick goals from placement. It was his place kick from the 35-yard line which enabled the Aggies to get a 3-3 tie with Ouachita last week. He'll be ready to boot them at the uprights if there is need. So much for the Aggies.

The Greenies are in the finest possible fettle. Psychology—in this case the emotional strain egging them on to revenge last years' game—favors the Tulane team.
