

Once again the Auburn Plainsmen come down from the "Lovliest Village" to be guests as well as rivals of the Green Wave and all Tulane supporters. A regular on the Tulane schedule, Auburn is always popular with the local fans.

Always noted for its heads-up brand of football, this Tiger has pulled off two of the neatest tricks seen in Tulane stadium. Years ago, when Don Zimmerman, wearing the green of Tulane, was the greatest back in the nation, Auburn had an All-Southern back in Jimmy Hitchcock. It was this Hitchcock who scooped up a punt that a Wave lineman thought he had grounded by merely touching the ball, and raced about sixty yards for a touchdown. Last year in the Auburn game, Harry Hays, Wave star, dropped back to pass, and Chalkley, Auburn tackle took the ball out of his hand and kept on running until he crossed the goal line. Chalkley will see service today.

For the last several years Auburn has played one of the toughest schedules in the country, and consequently rarely has a perfect season.

Besides picking on the best teams they can find each year, the Plainsmen play very few games at home. This year they play two at Auburn and two in Birmingham, their second home.

In 1937 it rained so hard on the day of the Tulane-Auburn game that the game was flooded out and had to be played on the following Mon-

day. Greenie stadium was literally an over-sized swimming pool.

Next Saturday the Green Wave moves over to Houston to play the Rice Owls in the first of three out of town games, and their second intersectional game. The Owls, always a good team, will put up strong opposition to the Wave invasion.
