The infamous LSU/Tulane game is here once more, complete with all the hoopla and rivalry which always accompanies it. If you weren't able to get tickets for the game on the 22nd, be sure to tune in for all the action to WTUL as the Voice of Tulane Sports, Steve Wolis, brings you play by play coverage of the game.

Here's some of the things going on around town:

Mose Allison will be at Tyler's November 20, and Irma Thomas will be playing at Tipitina's November 21...Ole' Man River's hosts Iggy Pop in a WTUL Concert Event November 22...Chicken Legs which is basically a Little Feat spinoff minus Lowell George, will play at Tipitina's November 25 & 26...Camelot begins its' run at the Saenger November 26 continuing through December 13, and the Cartoons play at the Dream Palace Thanksgiving night...November 29 gives you a choice of concerts: Kansas at the Centroplex in Baton Rouge, or the Neville Brothers at Tipitina's...Thin Lizzy, New England and Code Blue are at the Warehouse December 12...and Beatlemania is at the Saenger for six days in December, the 16-the 21. Also coming up at Tyler's will be Eddie Harris and the Brecker Brothers, but we're not sure when...To find out specifics about all the music going on in town, listen to 'TUL and call the clubs.

We don't have alot of information on which albums are going to be on the album hours this week, so all we can tell you is that on Thursday, November 20, The Pretenders have a special "Live Radio Broadcast" album that we will be playing at 10, and on Friday, November 21, we'll be playing the new album by Neil Young—"Hawks and Doves". Besides that, you'll have to keep tuned to 91.5 to find out what is being played. Also just a word to remind you that our album hours are for your listening pleasure only-the FCC deems it illegal to tape albums being broadcast over the airwaves.

On December 6, Mandeville Mike will play obscure "New Folk" music at 9:30, and the New Moon Half Quartet string band will play at 10.

'TUL also is doing a remote Little Feat special from Tipitina's on November 24 in celebration of Chicken Legs the rhythm section of Little Feat, who will be playing at Tips the following two nights, November 25 & 26. Also coming up, we'll be doing a live broadcast with the Brecker Brothers from Tylers in the very near future!
