Pottery making is a community industry in Chinautla, a little village near Guatemala City. Girls from the school's party observe the use of the finished product as a native woman prepares tortillas.





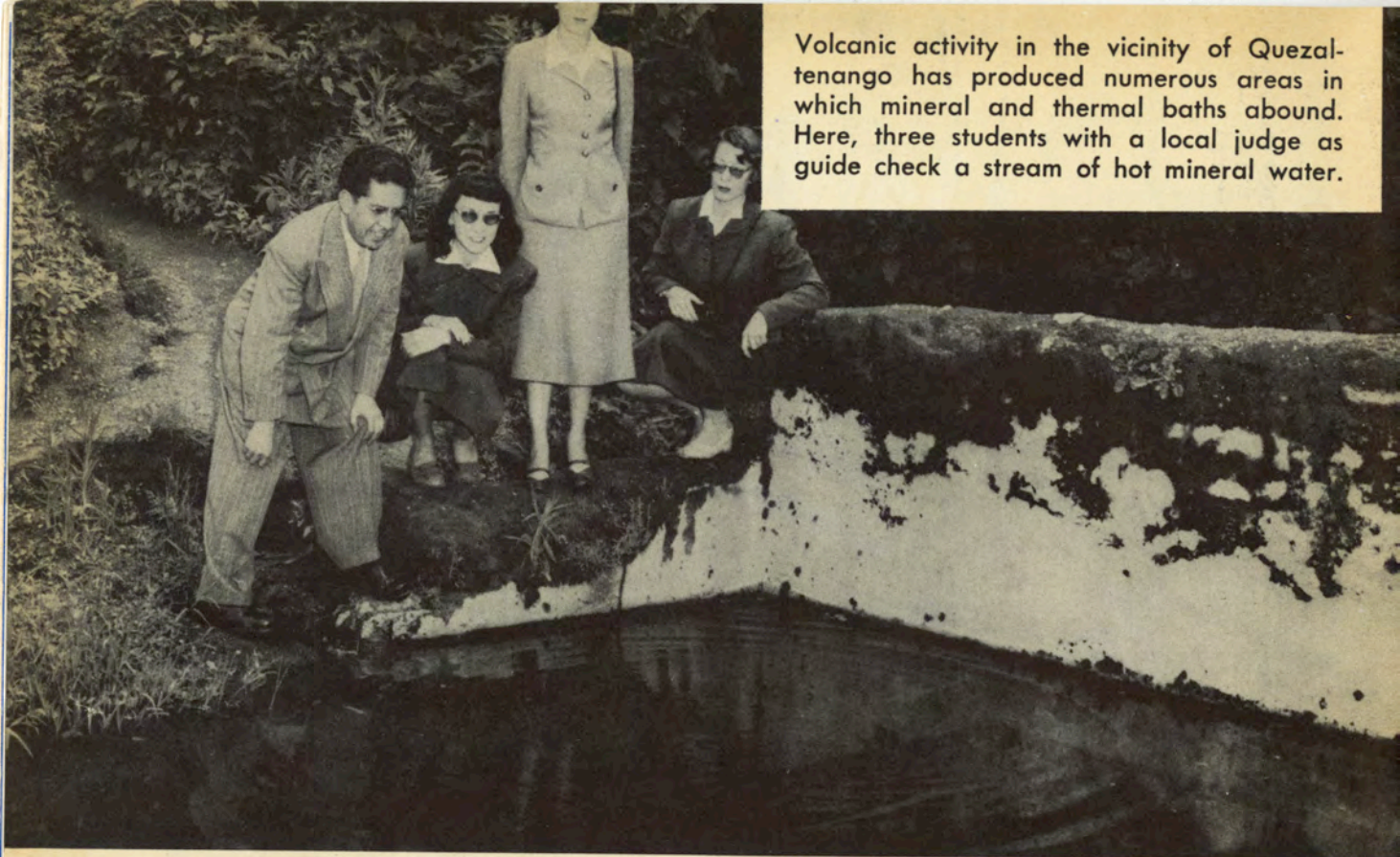

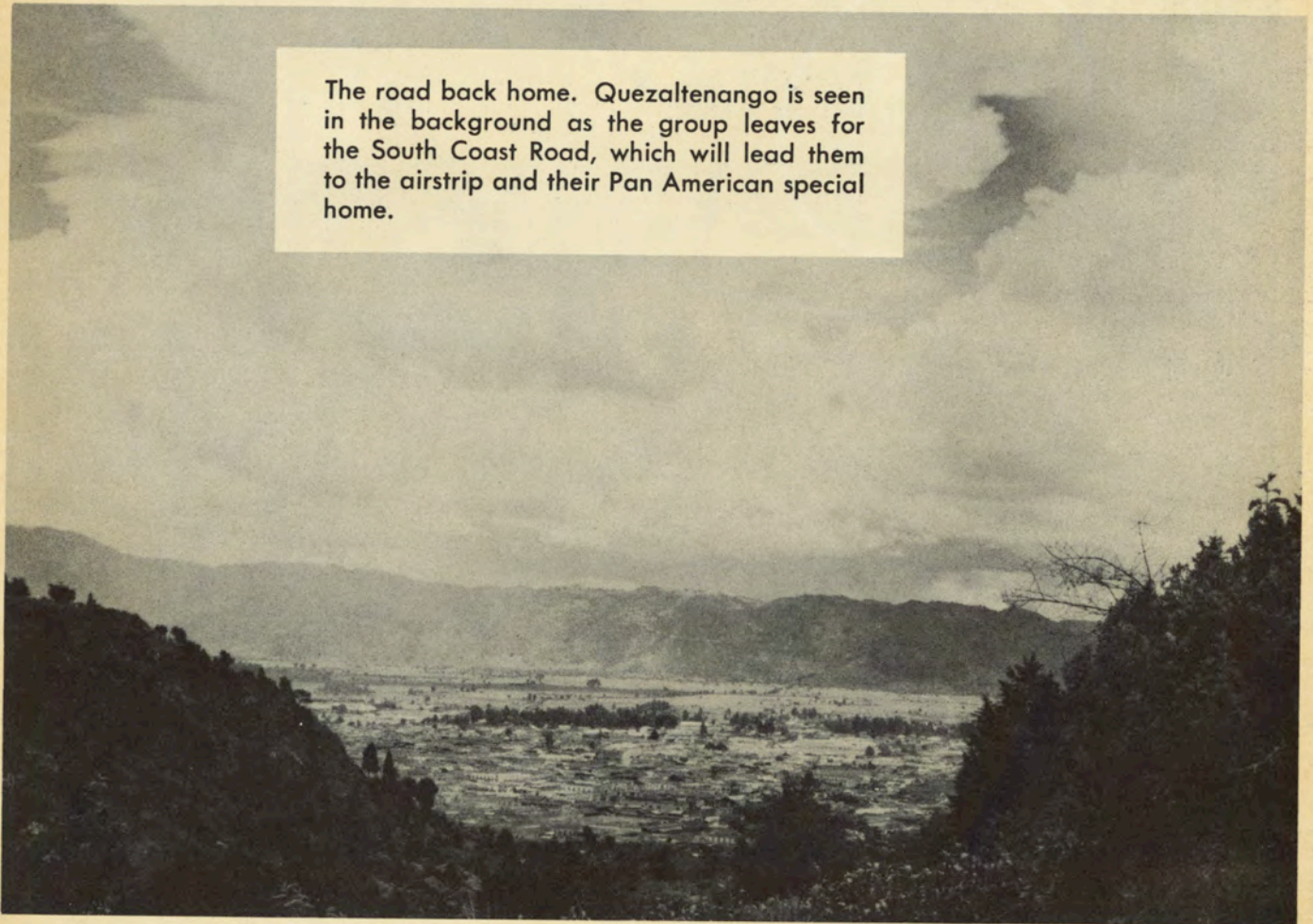


Observance of manufacture gives students an opportunity to study an important phase of native economy and presents a basis for studying commerce and trade.

The road back home. Quezaltenango is seen in the background as the group leaves for the South Coast Road, which will lead them to the airstrip and their Pan American special home.



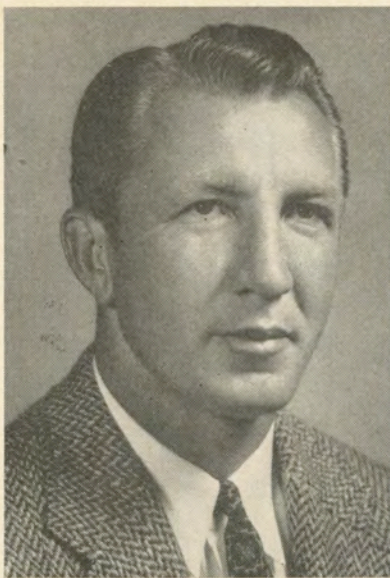
