

TODAY'S GAME

Two of the South's foremost educational institutions celebrate a half-century of football relations here in Tulane Stadium today. For it was in 1902 that Tulane and Auburn played their first football game — a zero-zero tie, setting the pattern that was to follow in closely fought football games.

Thirty-one games have gone into the record books up to this point today and that book tells a tale of fifteen wins for Tulane, 10 for the Tigers and six ties. Only since the war has Tulane dominated the series with five successive victories but that domination is endangered today.

The amazing Mr. Jordan, known as Shug around the friendliest little village, has converted a lethargic football team into a dangerous, potent powerhouse that already has knocked off Vanderbilt, 24-14, and Florida, 14-13, and forced Georgia Tech's high-flying Yellowjackets to take to the air for a 27-7 victory. Not one sportswriter nor fan would dare have predicted the reversal of form that has taken place in the Auburn combination and certainly one of the top coaching jobs this year has been turned in by this newcomer to head coaching ranks.

The Greenie task today is multi-fold but defensively it must undertake to stop the bull-dozing tactics of Homer Williams, a 180 pound fullback who chewed through Commodore and Gator lines with disdain. A power runner toward either side, Williams is the power in the Auburn attack and teams with quarterback Alan Parks to give the Tigers a diverse running and passing attack.
