

New in paperback**A CONFEDERACY OF DUNCES.***By John Kennedy Toole.**Grove Press, \$3.50.*

SWIFTLY becoming a cult novel, this is the posthumous book that won the Pulitzer Prize for 1979. Toole's vision of New Orleans, seen through the eyes of Ignatius J. Reilly, self-proclaimed genius, is rambunctious, uproarious, a work, many critics said, of high comedy. The book lay unpublished for years until the author's mother took it to New Orleans novelist Walker Percy who in turn offered it to the Louisiana State University Press. This low-priced trade softcover is a chance to get through the book that everybody's talking about.
