To Lewis Tappan Esq.

Sir-

The enclosed \$10. is for the benefit of the Mandians. Please appropriate one half of it, to assist in defraying the expenses of their outfit, + passage home, and the remainder, in supporting the mission contemplated among them.

That God will bless a mission, for which his Providence has so strikingly prepared the way, and the prayers + contributions of the friends of the slave, and of Africa not be withheld, we most confidently believe. Deeply do I regret, that my limited means allow of no larger contribution, at present, to so blessed a work. But, small as it is, I crave the privilege of reflecting, that, in the restoration of these unfortunate persons to home + happiness, and in the introduction of a pure religion, to their benighted countrymen I was a share, + send it as the "mite" of the
Widow of an Abolitionist Clergyman.

P.S. Should this be acknowledged through the "Emancipator", please not to designate the State or town from whence it came.
