- " James Smith Esqr Philadelphia. 10.00

Altogether amounting to the sum of One Hundred Dollars.

A Colored Man of the name of "Freeman", called this morning relative to the proceeds from the Sale of the Amistead & Congo. he says he was Steeward on board the U.S. vessel which Captured the Amistead, & thinks he is entitled to some portion of the Salvage awarded. If you should possess any information on this Subject & would Communicate it, to Mr. Hastings on his return
