I annex above a bill of expenses paid by me during the trial I believe you have a bill for cash paid Mr Booth of \$10.

You misunderstood James as to his having a place in view. He would be glad of a place for a few months & then return to Sierra Leone. I have not yet been able to secure any place for him yet. If you can do anything for him in New York please write me & I will send him down. or perhaps he might find a place in Farmington. He is now an expense.

You will see by the papers what I have sent you the state of public feeling here in regard to our late proceedings. The sentiment here is right in the minds of all whose opinion is worth
