Dear sir - A young man
(color) came to this Village yesterday, saying
he was Antonio. Takin' his to the Captain
of the Christie. I rather doubted his
being the young man he represented himself
to be, and felt somewhat anxious to know
whether Antonio was now in Conyngt
icnt. I shant say the lad was somewhat
over 5 feet high. quite a flat nose. & I think
had a scar on his right cheek. C. W. Murray

Thinks there is no doubt that the lad is
honest, & that he was on board the Christie
when Cinque rose & took command of
~~that~~ vessel. Will you have the goodness to
tell us whether Antonio has gone from
Conyngt - give us a description of his
size, features &c &c. I wish also to know
when the American & Foreign A.S.B. Society
will hold its anniversary, as I have as
yet seen no notice of the time &c.

to remind him of my letter, & tell him I
want to know immediately whether he can
help me any, and if he can, how much?

I want very much to attack the A.S. politi-
cal conventions. I do not as yet see it
expedient to have candidates for President &
Vice President nominated by the Abolitionists.

I think more care be taken for the slaves
by having the abolitionists of both parties, use
their influence at the next nominations
by their parties, and if they will not hear
us, then take the step that shall seem most
wise.

I may be all wrong ground, and if
I can hear the arguments that shall be ad-
vanced on both sides may change my views.
