Pleasant Valley Morgan County July 7 1866.

Dear Sir

According to promise I write you a few lines
I arrived here in five days from Boston after a
pleasant passage I found this place a
hilly country and the soil is composed of Chalken
lime and very muddy after a short rain and the
roads I am told is almost impassable in the winter
months. the land is rich and fertile, but is but
adapted for raising Cattle and Sheep and large
quantities are raised there The wheat crop was
much injured by the cold winter The hills
are all filled with coal, on the valley there is
much oil is taken from the earth and the wells
are in operation Some of them are 1000 feet deep
and worked by steam.

Since I have been here I find I have the
power given me to heal the Sick by laying on
of hands and have been very successful and
have effected many cures and many of long standing
chronic complaints so you will see old folks may
can do some good by laying hands on the Backeye
