

# Young Artists to Perform for Junior Philharmonic

Seven young artists will perform Saturday as the Junior Philharmonic Society opens its fall season with violin, piano and dance.

Laura Martin, Ava Rosenberg, Koji Morishita, Christopher Vath, Pearl Louis, Carol Collier and Dawn Lintinger were chosen in auditions last spring to perform in this concert which

will be held at 10:45 a.m. in Dixon Hall on the Newcomb College campus.

Laura, age 11, will play "Sketches in Color" by Starer. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William R. Martin is a sixth grader at the Academy of the Sacred Heart. She has studied piano for seven years, and has won the Ursuline Bach contest and the New Orleans Music Teachers Association Sonata Contest. Laura has performed with the New Orleans Symphony Youth Concerts and with the New Orleans Recreation Department Civic Orchestra.

Fifteen-year-old Ava is a tenth grader at Ecole Classique. She will play "Four Preludes for Piano, Opus 6" by Muczynski on the piano. A previous performer with the New Orleans Symphony Youth Concerts and the NORD Civic Orchestra, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph H. Rosenberg has studied piano for seven years.

Young Koji, age six, was born in Japan and has lived in the United States for one year. The son of Dr. and Mrs. Yoshio Morishita is a student at Lusher Elementary School. A violinist, Koji will perform "Musette" by Bach, "Bouree" by Handel, "Barcarolle" by Riegger, and "Dance Song" by Kabalesvsky.

Another pianist, Christopher, age 12, will play "Four Rondos" by Kabalesvsky. The son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Vath, Christopher is a seventh grader at St. Gabriel School, and has studied piano for six years. He was a winner of the New Orleans Music Teachers Association Sonata Contest, and in the past has performed with the NORD Civic Orchestra. This year he will perform with the New Orleans Symphony Youth Concerts.

Pearl, 13, who is pianist at the Chinese Presbyterian Church, will play "Gigue" from "Suite for Harpsichord" by Loeliet, "Scotch Poem" by MacDowell, and the first movement of "Sonatina in C" by Ka-

balesvsky. The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Gain L. Louis is a ninth grader at Grace King High School. She has studied piano for five years and has won the Piano Guild Bach Award and Sonatina Award and the Ursuline Bach Contest.

Carol Collier and Dawn Lintinger are the two dancers on the program. Carol, 15 is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. G. Collier. She is a tenth grader at Mt. Carmel Academy, and has studied dancing for ten years. A member of Ballet Hysell, Carol has attended the American Dance Camp in Gulfport, Miss.

Dawn, 19, has also been a dancing student for ten years. For two years Dawn has studied dancing on a scholarship at Southern Methodist University; she also has studied at the Rebecca Harkness School at Watch Hill, R.I., a member of Ballet Hysell, Dawn is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. J. Lintinger.
