Dan Miller, a 12-year-old pianist from Lafayette, will open the program by playing "The Bear" by Rebikoc, Diversion No. 9 by Muczynski, and Four Louisiana-French Folk Songs arranged by Brown. A four-year student of the instrument, Dan has also won superior ratings in organ and violin and was the 1973 district winner of the Louisiana Music Teachers Association Rally. Son of Mrs. David Miller, Dan is a seventh grader at L. J. Alleman School.

Sixteen-year-old flutist, Kim Smith, will follow with a performance of Concertino by Chaminade. Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. McRee J. Smith, Kim has studied flute for six years. A junior at Grace King High School, she has played with the Jefferson Pario and

District Honor Bands. Last summer she won a scholarship to the L.S.U. Quintet Workshop, and she was recently selected to join the Collegiate Wind Band.

Soprano Linda Council, a senior at the University of Southwestern Louisiana, has studied voice for four years and piano for 10 years. She has perform ed prominent roles in many U.S.L. Opera Guild productions including Greel in "Hansel and Gretel," Latitia in "The Old Maid and the Thief," and Suzanna in "The Marriage of Figaro." She has also appeared as a soloist with the U.S.L. Chamber Choir and Chorale. Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. T. Council, Linda is a member of the Vermillion and Kappa Delta Pi honor societies.
