Junior Philharmonic Society to Hold Final Concert Friday

The final program of the Junior Philharmonic Society's 1970-71 series will be held Friday at 8 p.m. at Dixon Hall. The group will receive the annual gold key of the year award and the outstanding performer annual scholarship award.

Performing at the concert will be Melissa Lucia, flautist; Mary McNeill Wilson, soprano; Sidney Norris, pianist; and Dawn Lintinger, dancer.

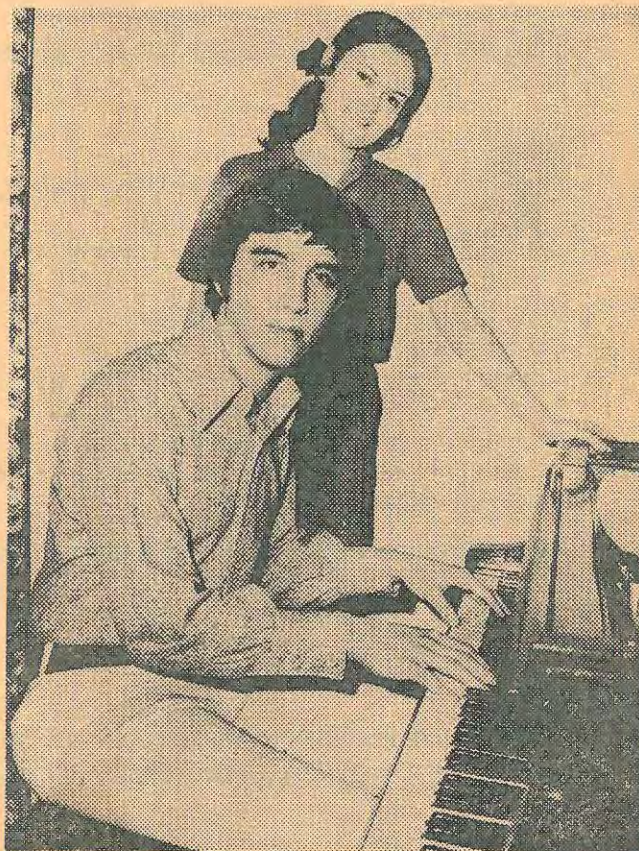
Twenty-one-year-old Melissa Lucia will play Concerto for Flute by Ibert. The University of Southwestern Louisiana senior has studied flute for five years.

Mary McNeill Wilson will sing "Oh, quand je dors" by Liszt, "La canzone di Doretta" from "La Rondine" by Puccini, "Lerchengesang" by Brahms, and "Ecstasy" by Walter Rummel. A soloist with the Loyola Grand Chorus and Loyola Chorale, Mary, has studied voice for three years. She is 22 years old.

Loyola freshman Sidney Norris Jr., who has been studying piano for 11 years, will be third on the program. Sidney will play Intermezzo in A Major by Brahms, and Ballade in G Minor by Chopin.

Dancer Dawn Lintinger, age 20, has performed on three previous Junior Philharmonic programs. She will dance a variation from Tchaikovsky's "Swan Lake."

An award ceremony will also be held at this concluding concert. Each performer who has played with the Junior Philhar-
