### YOUNG ARTISTS TO PERFORM IN DIXON HALL

Pianists, violinists, and dancers will be featured on the first of a four-program series sponsored by the Junior Philharmonic Society of New Orleans. Gathered around Edmund LaCour at the piano are ballerinas Donielle Duvigneaud and Fawn Archambault.

Pianists, violinists, and ballerinas will be featured in the season's first Junior Philharmonic Society recital to begin at 10:45 a.m. Saturday in Dixon Hall on the Newcomb College campus.

Donielle Duvigneaud, a seven-year student of ballet, will open the program by dancing *The Russian Doll* from "La Boutique Fantastique" by Rossini-Respighi. A seventh grader at St. Pius X School, Donielle, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. J. Donald Duvigneaud, also enjoys swimming, tennis, and gymnastics.

Thirteen-year-old pianist Mary Duval will follow by playing "Two Gossips" by Stone, *Mouvement Perpetuel No. 1* by Poulenc, "The Little White Donkey" by Ibert, and "Run Run!" by Pinto. Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John A. Duval of Lafayette, La., Mary was the 1972 state winner of the Baldwin Junior Keyboard Achievement Award and the 1973 first place winner of the Louisiana Music Teachers Association Rally. A sophomore at the Academy of Sacred Heart in Grand Cocteau, La., multi-talented Mary also studies ballet and is a member of the Acadian Ballet Company.

Gilo Kawasaki, who has studied the violin for 10 of his 15 years, will play *Meditation* from the opera "Thais" by Massenet and "Hoe Down" by Copland. Son of Mr. and Mrs. M. S. Kawasaki, Gilo was the 1968 recipient of the Irving Carr Memorial Award and the 1970 recipient of the Outstanding String Student Award from the Federation of Music Clubs. A previous Junior Phil-

harmonic winner, Gilo is a junior at Slidell High School.

Another previous Junior Philharmonic winner, 15-year-old Edmund LaCour, will play the *Allegro moderato* movement from the *Sonata in E flat* by Haydn and *Rondo on Argentine Folk Tunes* by Ginastera. Edmund, son of Mr. and Mrs. Owen J. LaCour, was the 1970 and 1972 winner of the NORD Concerto Contest and the 1972 grand prize winner of the Ursuline Bach Festival. A sophomore at Jesuit High School, Edmund has studied piano for nine years.

As a special recital feature, young students of the Tulane

Suzuki Violin School will give a demonstration of the Suzuki method of instruction.

Fifteen-year-old Fawn Archambault, an 11-year student of ballet, will close the morning performance. Daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Douglas P. Archambault, Fawn is a sophomore and honor student at O. Perry Walker Senior High School. She will dance to music from the opera "Carmen" by Bizet.

The Junior Philharmonic Society of New Orleans was founded to afford young students of music and dance an opportunity to perform in a professional atmosphere and to teach music appreciation to non-performers.
