WINNING TRIO TO BE HEARD

Recital Will Be Given at
McMain School Next
Thursday

The Philharmonic Society will present the winners of the Junior Philharmonic competition in recital on Thursday at 8 o'clock at the Eleanor McMain High school. Those playing are Gloria Thomas, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. G. H. A. Thomas, and June Rose Roepe, daughter of Mrs. H. B. Roepe, both of whom are 11 years old, and Margery Negueloua, 16-year-old daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. Henry H. Negueloua.

All three performers made the national honor roll in the national piano tournament last year. Gloria represented New Orleans in the state federation contest last year, and June Rose won first place in the state federation contest two years ago.

Gloria started studying the piano at the age of 8, and June Rose began her study at the age of 3. Margery has won two gold medals in state federation contests, and a first prize for an original composition in music. At the age of 9 she won the silver loving cup in the New Orleans piano contest.

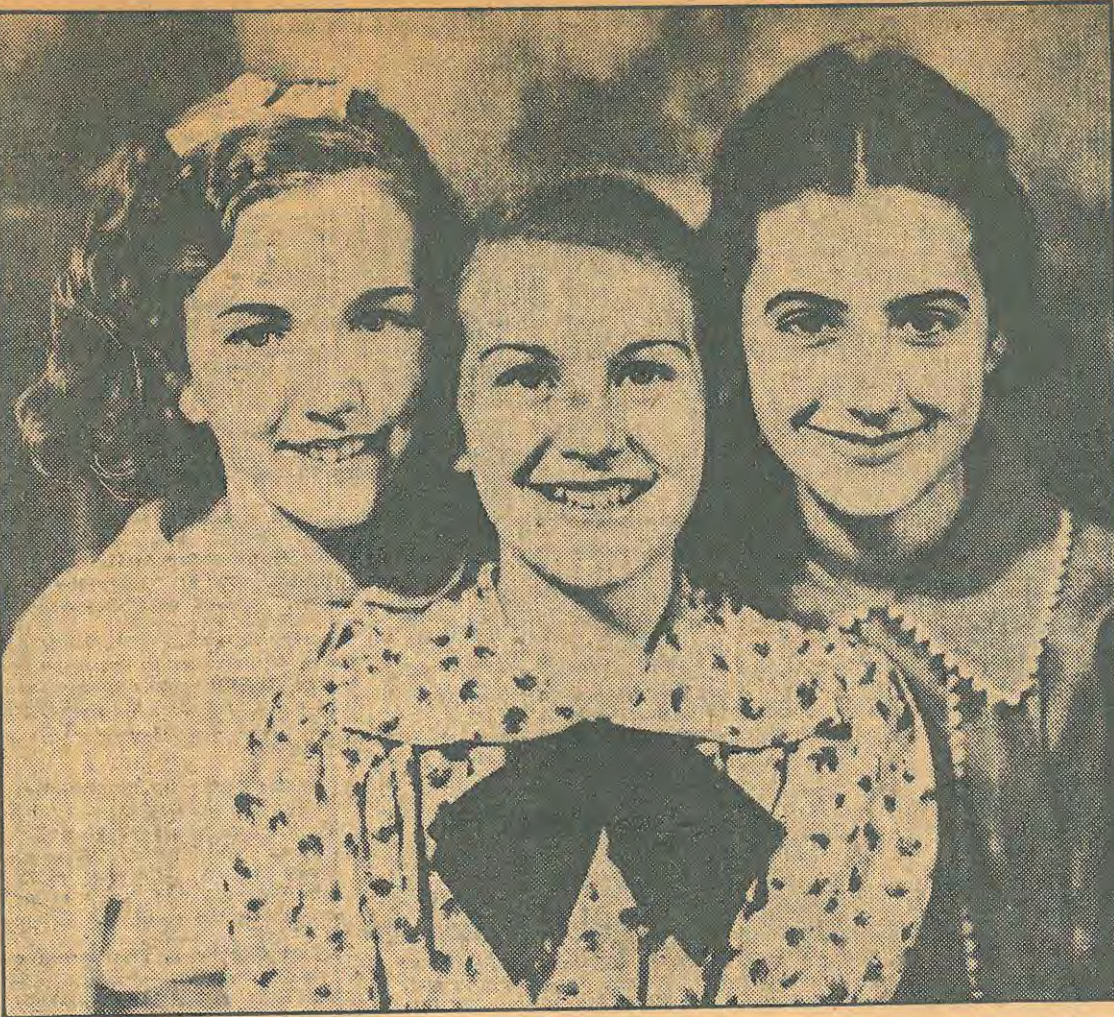
