

Junior Philharmonic to present young artists in concert

The Junior Philharmonic Society of New Orleans will present its 271st performance featuring the talents of 12 young instrumentalists and dancers from throughout the New Orleans area who range in age from fourth-grade through college senior Sunday at 2 p.m. at Tulane's Dixon Hall. Admission is free.
