

YOUNG PIANIST AWARDED GRANT

Miss Paula Sigler Re-
ceives Scholarship

Paula Sigler, 16-year-old pianist, has won the 1968 scholarship award of the Junior Philharmonic Society.

Miss Sigler received the award from Mrs. Louis Dutrey, president of the society, at the group's final concert of the season Friday night at Dixon Hall, Newcomb College. Miss Sigler appeared on the concert series last February playing a Brahms Rhapsody.

The young pianist, a junior at the Louise S. McGehee School, has studied music for the past 10 years. She plans to continue music studies in college. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. L. W. Sigler of New Orleans.

Honored on the same evening was the Junior Philharmonic Society itself.
